Other training clusters aim to support the diverse development needs of our friends and partners. For example, the Smart Cities cluster focuses on technology-driven opportunities, while the Economy and Infrastructure cluster addresses sustainable and inclusive development.

Singapore recognises that the SCP is a two-way street. As we have shared our experiences, we have also learnt from the expertise of some 130,000 SCP participants from 170 countries and territories since 1992. This exchange allows all of us to learn and progress together, as we work to shape a collective future.

I hope that you will continue to find the SCP relevant and useful as we move forward together.


